Courses requiring NFPA 1403 prerequisite(s) or firefighter certification require a **signed approval form from the fire chief submitted with payment** (page 18). **A PERMISSION LETTER from department chief must be submitted with payment when enrolling in Arson I course regardless of age.**

## EXPLORERS/JUNIOR FIREFIGHTERS

- We Welcome Explorers/Jr. FFs! The Dixie Firefighters Association and SFRT will make sure that these guidelines are followed.
- Students attending classes under the age of 18 must complete and submit the Explorer permission form on page 17.
- Students ages 16-17 wanting to take Drivers Training **must submit a copy of their drivers license and the Explorer Permission Form** (page 15) with payment and **bring their own POV to drive.**
- Students ages 16-17 wanting to take EMS Continuing Education **must submit a copy of their First Responder card and the Explorer Permission Form** (page 15) with payment.
- We observe a **zero tolerance policy** for disrespectful or disruptive behavior. Explorers/Jr. Firefighters that exhibit disruptive or disrespectful behaviors will be asked to leave. The students parents (guardian) and the fire chief will be notified of the dismissal.

## COLLEGE CREDIT HOURS & CERTIFICATES

- College degree credit hours are awarded for all indicated "FRS" courses. These courses require a written and/or skill exam to receive college credit. **Firefighter application must be completed or no college credit can be awarded.** All other courses are offered for non-degree credit.
- Instructors will award certificates/training hours at the completion of each course for actual hours student is in class. DFS **certificates** will be awarded after attending the **entire course**. No certificates will be awarded for partial completion. Students are responsible for entering their training hours into the Kentucky Fire Commission training records system. Obtain a yellow sheet from the instructor for partial training.

# EMS TRAINING

## EMS Continuing Education

20 hours Friday, Saturday & Sunday

This course will provide 20 hours of Basic Refresher training for both **First Responders and EMT-Basics**, which is required for National Registry and KBEMS re-certification.

Mass Casualties Disaster Management (P0006 – 1 hr.) Preparatory (P0007 – 3 hrs.) Airway (P0008 – 3 hrs.) Patient Assessment (P0009 – 4 hrs.) Medical (P0010 – 4 hrs.) Trauma (P0011 – 3 hrs.) OBGYN/ITC (P0012 – 2 hrs.)

The class will start Friday, March 9, 2012 at 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. (4 hours) in the RPC building at ECTC. The class will continue at 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Saturday (8 hours) and Sunday (8 hours), March 10 and 11, 2012.

## EMS Instructor Evaluator (BB0000)

8 hours Sunday

Required by Kentucky Regulations, this course is designed to equip the evaluator to competently and effectively evaluate candidates at practical skills examinations of all levels. It ensures fair and objective evaluation of candidates by acquainting evaluators with accepted, standardized procedures promoted by the NREMT and the State of Kentucky. It promotes consistency at practical skills examinations across the state by providing the evaluator with a working knowledge of regulatory requirements, evaluator qualifications and responsibilities, and staffing/equipment requirements.

**Prerequisites:** Certified EMS Instructor

## EMS Instructor Orientation (BB0000)

8 hours Saturday

This class is designed to educate the EMS Instructor Candidate in utilization of the U.S. DOT National Standard Curriculum as the training guidelines for initial and refresher training for First Responder, EMT-Basic, and Paramedic Education conducted throughout the Commonwealth. This course is one of the requirements to become an EMS Educator certified by the Kentucky Board of EMS (KBEMS).

# FIRE TRAINING

## Aerial Operations (HH0000)

16 hours Saturday & Sunday

With the addition of aerial apparatus in many fire departments across the Commonwealth, this course will train aerial operators on proper procedures to use when operating Aerial Apparatus through a series of classroom exercises, demonstrations, and practical skills sessions.

**Equipment Needed:** Full turnout gear

**Prerequisites:** None

**Instructor(s):** Elizabethtown Fire Department

## Arson I - FRS 2074 (Y0000)

16 hours Saturday & Sunday

This course is the National Fire Academy's "Arson Detection for the First Responder." The classroom delivery will cover many phases of initial fire scene investigation with emphasis on the firefighter's responsibility in arson detection. This course satisfies the requirement for FRS 2074 in the KCTCS AAS Fire/Rescue Technology Degree Program. Students should be prepared to take an exam at the conclusion of the course.

**Prerequisite:** MUST HAVE PERMISSION LETTER FROM CHIEF OF DEPARTMENT SENT IN WITH REGISTRATION.

## Basic Firefighting

16 hours Saturday & Sunday

This course covers 16 of the 20 recommended hours for a new firefighter in Kentucky and offers both classroom and hands-on training.

## Certified Company Inspector II (DD0000)

16 hours Saturday & Sunday

This class is the thirs step in the Fire Marshal's newly revised inspector certification program. This class is designed for the fire inspectors and building code officials that deal with life safety issues on a daily basis. The students will get detailed instruction on occupancy requirements and occupant loads. This class will consist of two days of instruction followed by an exam. Students are encouraged to bring a tablet and calculator.

**Prerequisites:** Fire Inspector I

<b>Driver's Training - FRS 2031 (CC0001)</b>	<b>8 hours Saturday or Sunday</b>

This course will use the Kentucky Fire Commission approved curriculum for Driver's Training. Topics such as safe operation of fire apparatus, laws regulating operation, and frequent causes of accidents will be discussed. Students should be prepared to take an exam at the conclusion of the course. **Those under the age of 18 must submit a copy of their KY driver's license with the permission form on page 17 in order to sign up for this class.** This course satisfies the requirement for FRS 2031 in the KCTCS AAS Fire/Rescue Technology Degree Program. Upon successful completion of the course, 0.8 hour of degree credit will be awarded for FRS 2031.

**Equipment Needed:** Full turnout gear and SCBA with PASS device and spare bottle. All turnout gear must be NFPA compliant; students will not be allowed to participate if the instructor(s) find that the gear is not NFPA compliant or otherwise poses a hazard. SCBA bottles must have a current hydrostatic test date.

**Prerequisites:** Completion of NFPA 1403 required components prior to enrolling; "Live Fire Course Competency Validation" form (page 16) must be mailed in with payment. Any student with facial hair that impedes the seal of the face piece will not be allowed to participate in accordance with NFPA Standards.

This class is designed for company officers and other fire or rescue service personnel with the responsibility of conducting periodic company level or small unit training; introduces the participant to basic instructional concepts and techniques; emphasizes teaching principles and techniques applicable to fire and rescue service training; includes effective communication, teaching from lesson plans, methods of instruction, with emphasis on skills training and adult learning.

To become a certified instructor, you must meet the requirements set forth by the State Fire Commission including IFSAC Accredited Firefighter I and II certification.

**Leadership II: Strategies Personal Success – FRS2073 (AA0000) 16 hours Saturday & Sunday**

Running an effective fire service organization, whether career, combination, or volunteer, requires leaders. Many line and administrative officers are very competent in technical areas, but need training and skill practice in key managerial strategies to reach their full potential in leading their organizations. This course is targeted at company level, junior line officers (lieutenant, captain, etc.) who wish to improve basic leadership skills in such areas as managing multiple roles, creativity, establishment of a "personal power base" and ethics. It may also be applicable to those administrative officers of volunteer organizations (president, secretary/treasurer, etc.) who find that their responsibilities require similar skills. Students should be prepared to take an exam at the conclusion of the course. This course satisfies the requirement for FRS 2073 in the KCTCS AAS Fire/Rescue Technology Degree Program.

**MCTO—Decision Making - FRS 2062 (AA0000)**

16 hours Saturday &amp; Sunday

This National Fire Academy course provides essential information for the first arriving company officer and has valuable information on initial operations for experienced chief officers. Incident size-up and development and implementing an incident action plan, using ICS principles and NIMS operations will be used. Scenarios emphasize course principles and the opportunity to learn from others. Upon successful completion of the course 1.0 hour of degree credit will be awarded for FRS 2062. Students should be prepared to take an exam at the conclusion of the course.

**NFPA 1403-Conducting Live Training Burns (BB0000)**

Training burns located in burn buildings, acquired structure, and vehicle fires will be covered. The course will include compliance issues with the EPA/KY Division of Air Quality, NFPA 1403 & 1500, NIMS, Water Supply, EMS, and Rehab.

This course covers the basic management techniques applicable to effectively administering a fire service organization. This course covers basic principles of planning, organizing, and controlling, fire department functions and managing personnel, records including Workman's Comp forms, State Aid, NFIRS, and ISO requirements. This is for the Officer or Firefighter that needs to know the "ins" and "outs" of managing a fire department.

**Preparing for Initial Company Operations (PICO) FRS 2016 (X0000) 16hours Saturday & Sunday**

The course components include: Preparation for response, decision-making, and tactical operations. Upon successful completion of the course, 0.8 credit hour of degree credit in FRS 2016 will be awarded. Students should be prepared to take an exam at the conclusion of the course. All turnout gear must be NFPA compliant; students will not be allowed to participate if the instructors find that the gear is not NFPA compliant or otherwise poses a hazard. SCBA bottles must have a current hydrostatic test date.

**Prerequisite:** Completion of NFPA 1403 required components prior to enrolling; "Live Fire Course Competency Validation" form (page 18) must be mailed in with payment. Students with facial hair impeding the face piece seal will not be allowed to participate - NFPA Standards.

**Pump Operations - FRS 2023 (Z0001)**

16 hours Saturday &amp; Sunday

This course will cover the State Fire Rescue Training Approved Curriculum for Pump Operations and includes the minimum requirements of professional competence of fire service pump operators. Various types of apparatus-mounted pumps will be covered along with relevant terminology and technical information. Upon successful completion of the course, 1.1 hours of degree credit will be awarded for FRS 2023. Students should be prepared to take an exam at the conclusion of the course.

**Farm Rescue (Q0006)**

- Rural vs. urban farm accidents
- Common types of farm accidents and special challenges
- Understanding farm equipment mechanics
- Special situations when responding
- Management of farm related incidents
- Extrication and disentanglement techniques

**Equipment Needed:** Turnout gear or coveralls, fire helmet or hardhat, safety glasses, work gloves, and steel toed boots

**Open to Ages 15-17**

**Firefighter Survival & Rescue - FRS 2052 (FC0001/FC0002) 16 hours Saturday & Sunday**

This course is designed to help firefighters save themselves when trapped or involved in an impending flashover. The course is required for Kentucky Firefighter Certification and upon successful completion of the course, 1.1 hours of degree credit will be awarded for FRS 2052. **“Participant” certificates issued to all completing required skills. “Observer” certificates issued to those that attend lecture only.**

**Equipment Needed:** Full turnout gear including SCBA and PASS device

**Prerequisites:** Competent in the use of Personal Protective Equipment. Permission Form if Exp/Jr. FF

**Instructor(s):** Brent Francis, SFRT Area 2

**Open to Ages 15-17**

**Intermediate Rope Rescue (I0000/Q0000) 16 hours Saturday & Sunday**

The Operations Level Intermediate class is intended to take the Basic/Awareness rescuer to a level of greater mobility and effectiveness in the vertical environment. Basic skills reinforced and new skills will be: transition from descending to ascending, knot passing, weight transfers, litter operations, litter lowering evolutions, and “pick-off” rescues. These skills will enable the rescuer to deal with the complexity of weighted litter operations and higher level of a safety/mobility.

**Equipment Needed:** Helmet, chin strap, suspension system meeting UIAA, OSHA, NIOS, or NFPA standards, clean leather gloves not been used for firefighting or chemicals handling, sturdy boots with ankle support (no fire boots), clothing to match the weather. Any personal equipment brought to the class will be the responsibility of the owner and will have to be inspected and approved by the instructors before use.

**Prerequisites:** Completion of KCTCS Basic/Awareness Rope class, fitness level to handle weight in sometimes awkward positions, and ability/desire to work safely in a team effort. This class is physically demanding and all hands on.

**Lead Instructors:** Mike, Ron, and Nancy Wheeler, SFRT Area 5

**The Worst Day of Your Career (Q0000) 8 hours Saturday or Sunday**

This class will cover the impact of serious injury to firefighters. This will include recap of a fire apparatus accident that sent 5 Meade County Fire District firefighters to University Hospital following apparatus accident. Also presented will be the story of Captain Michael Long of the Camp Taylor Fire Protection District who fell into a fiery basement and his rescue, treatment and recovery from severe burns. The afternoon session will look at heavy vehicle accidents involving fire apparatus.

**Equipment Needed:** Full turnout gear or coveralls, helmet or hardhat, gloves, steel-toed shoes, and eye protection.

**Prerequisites:** Minimum of 3 years experience as a Certified Firefighter with working knowledge of rescue tools and equipment

**Vehicle Rescue (Q0001) 16 hours Saturday & Sunday**

This course includes classroom and practical evolutions. New vehicles, hybrid and multi-airbag cars will be discussed. Students will demonstrate their knowledge of basic hands-on extrication principles. Based on availability, large vehicles such as busses, may be used in addition to the cars for hands-on practice in the course.

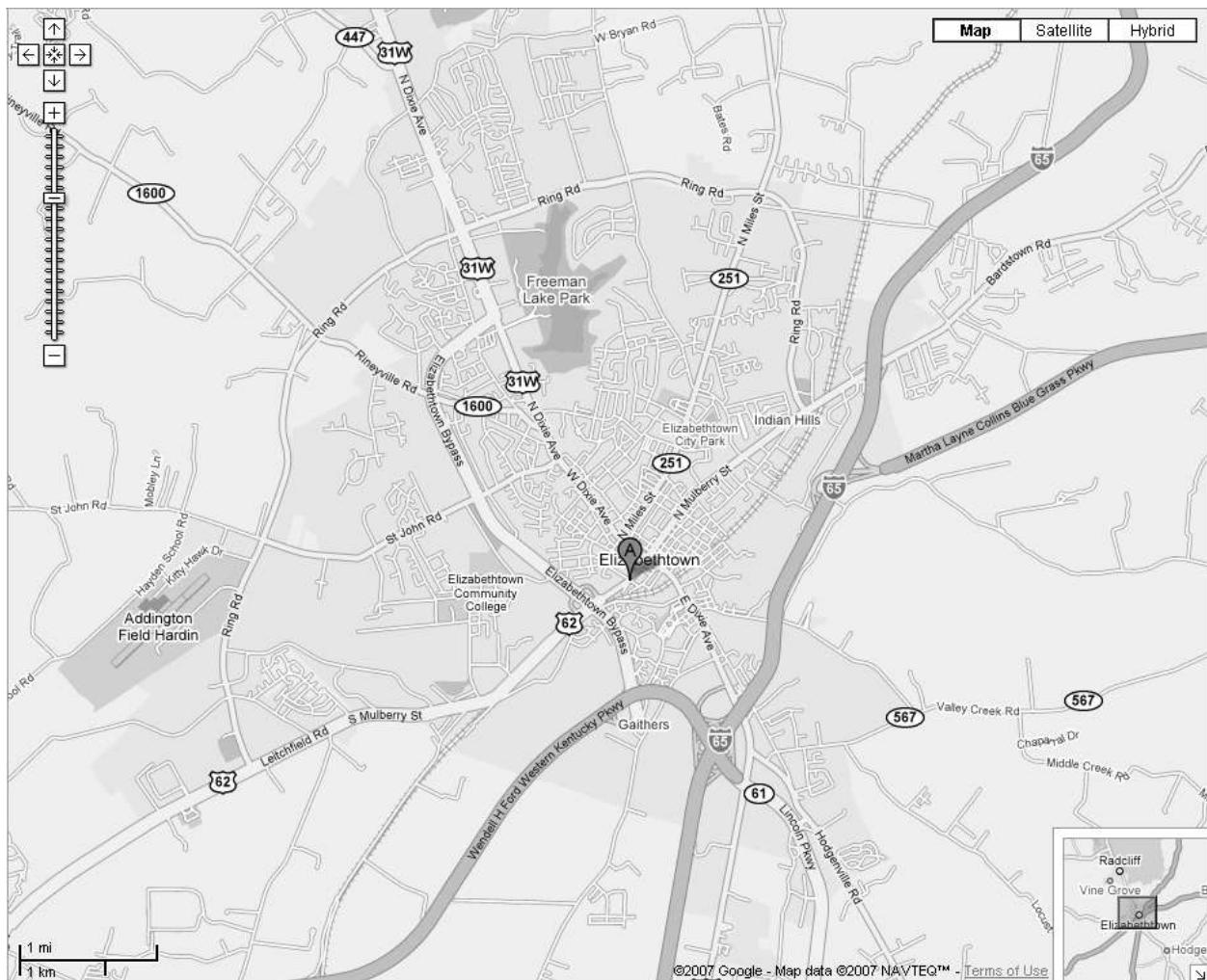

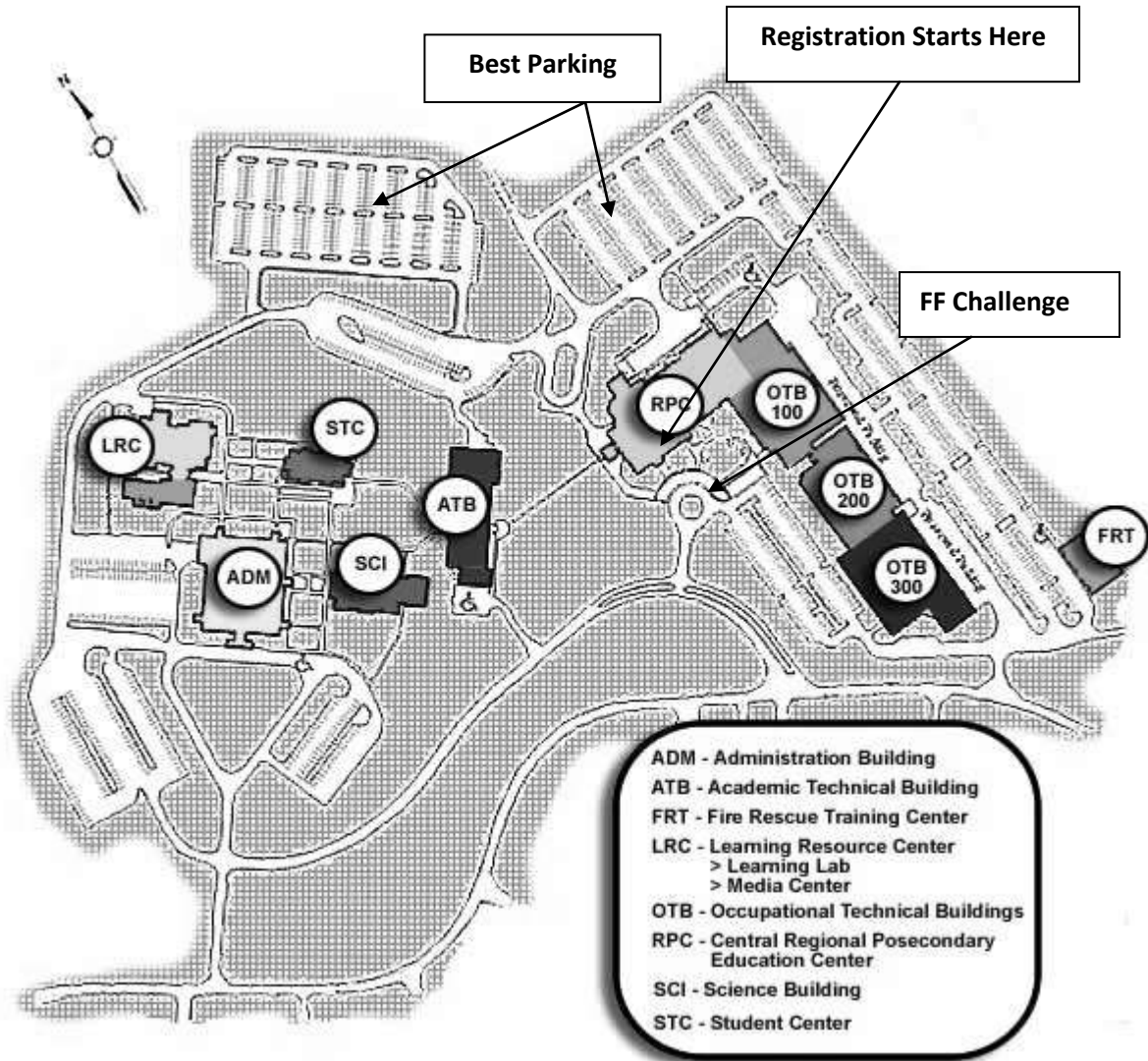
